## Growth

### \$10 a week (\$520 a year) could:

- pay for needed school supplies for children in our Head Start program

### \$20 a week (\$1,040 a year) could:

- support five families with food vouchers to assure proper nutrition for healthy brain development

### \$50 a week (\$2,600 a year) could:

- pay for medical needs and treatment not covered for children living in poverty

### \$100 a week (\$5,200 a year) could:

- fill our operating budget deficit to sustain our Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program

### \$10,000 a year could:

- fill our operating budget deficit to sustain two children's programs (Healthy Families and Head Start) which serve children who are at risk of not growing mentally, physically and emotionally ready for school

All contributions will go to Cardinal Services operations unless otherwise requested by donor.

### \$50 a week (\$2,600 a year) could:

- pay for assistive technology such as mobile devices, screen enlargers, communication boards, and work related adaptive equipment for people with disabilities

### \$7,500 a year could:

- fill our operating budget deficit to sustain our public transportation service that provided over 65,000 rides last year to people without means of transportation to get to jobs, medical appointments, school and much more

### \$50,000 a year could:

- purchase an accessible bus for our public transportation division to safely transport people with transportation needs to work, school, medical appointments, and social events

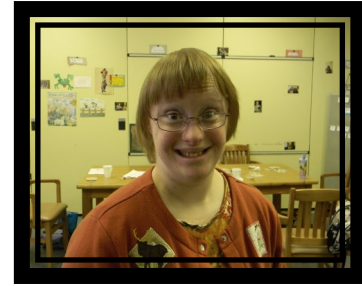

## Dignity



### \$20 a week (\$1,040 a year) could:

- create access to community activities to enhance social development for adults with disabilities

### \$50 a week (\$2,600 a year) could:

- pay for assistive technology such as mobile devices, screen enlargers, communication boards, and personal care adaptive equipment for adults with disabilities

### \$100 a week (\$5,200 a year) could:

- pay for adaptive equipment such as a specialized powered wheelchair for adults with severe disabilities

### \$25,000 a year could:

- sponsor our day services program by purchasing supplies, equipment, pay for appropriate staffing, and much more so that adults with disabilities can continue to learn basic living and social skills needed to be active members of their community

### \$100,000 a year could:

- fill our operating budget deficit to sustain our apartment living program which serves adults with significant developmental disabilities
